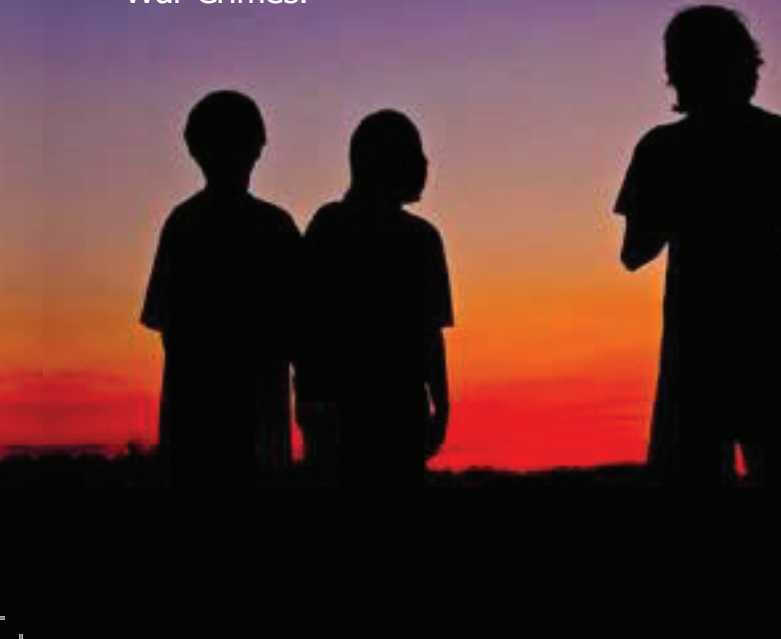


Have you been a victim or a witness to war crimes?

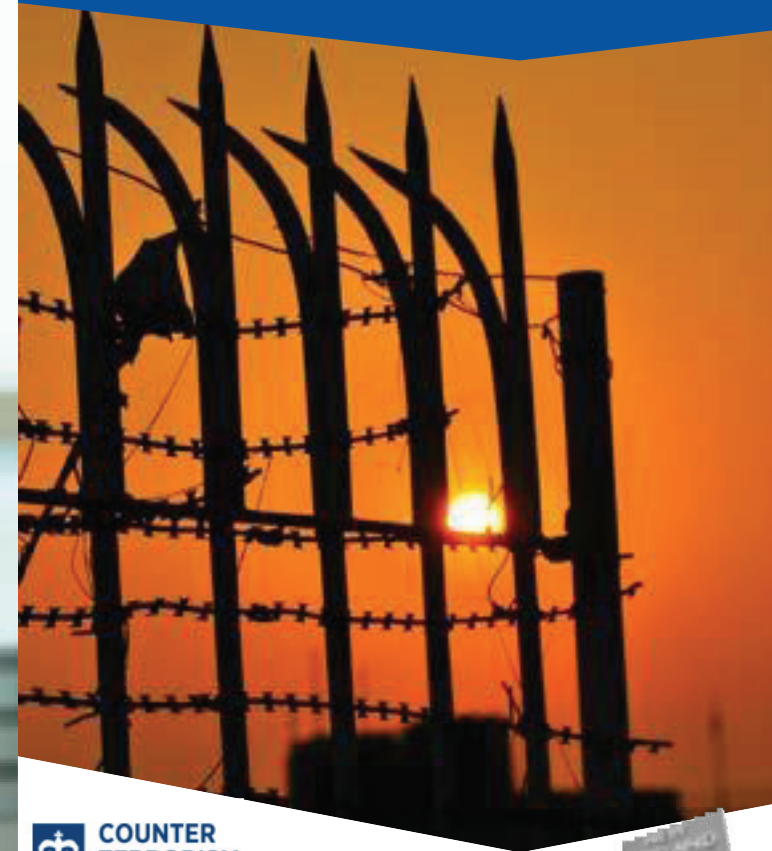

Who we are

The Counter Terrorism Policing (CTP) War Crimes Team, hosted by SO15 has national responsibility for investigations into Genocide, Crimes against Humanity, War Crimes and Torture.

Our team of Specialist Detectives assess all information received and where appropriate commence an investigation to gather evidence of potential crimes. We work with the Crown Prosecution Service, other jurisdictions and international bodies to ensure suspects of core international crimes do not evade justice.

The United Kingdom should not be a safe haven for people who have committed crimes during conflict.

We work with partner agencies to prosecute those responsible for violence, sexual assaults, torture and displacement of people in times of war. We will consider allegations from any country in the world.

You can help by providing information that identifies suspects living in this country and the crimes they may have committed. You can also help by telling us about other witnesses and survivors of crimes who may be willing to speak with us.

We will listen to you and where appropriate, take statements, gather evidence and conduct enquiries to investigate potential crimes.

We will explain the investigative process to you and what we will do with the information you provide.

The police in England and Wales are independent from the Government and the Courts. We work with people and organisations from across the world to secure evidence independently and fairly.

Have you been a victim of war crimes?
